

The most famous Andalusian "Fiesta" (celebration) is the "Feria de Abril de Sevilla" (April Fair). Once a year, in April or early May, Seville celebrates this exuberant local "happening", where meeting friends, drinking sherry, riding horses and carriages and dancing Flamenco are the order of the day.

As your local DMC, we will grant you the opportunity to live this brilliant and lively celebration, first hand!

For small and medium-size groups, we will rent a caseta (private house typically built for the Fair) and organize a typical lunch or dinner accompanied by flamenco, rumbas, sevillanas, wine pourers and Iberian cured ham...

For big groups or in case you are unable to make it to Seville just for the Fair, we can recreate the April Fair just for you!!!





The city seems totally dedicated to high-spirited and vivacious celebration. It shows in the dark eyes of beautiful women, in the golden wine (Manzanilla) that fills the "Catavinos" (glasses), in the sound of the guitar, the hand-clapping and the rhythmic tapping of the dancers, the "Bailaores".

Pretty local ladies fill the fairground with their frilled dresses, dashing horsemen show off their prowess by making their fine Andalusian horses trot in elegant circles. This is a very usual custom, adding to the charm of the Fair.

The conventional "Casetas" of the Fair – wooden frames covered with canvas and many coloured trimmings – are a kind of temporary home given over to high spirited enjoyment.













During the Fair the inhabitants of Seville spare no expense. Good humour, gaiety and genuine expressions of goodwill abound in the streets, day and night, throughout the whole city. Food and drink: Many of the "casetas" offer a wide variety of food. The most typical and popular dishes during the Feria are: Fried fish and seafood, Iberian cured meat and cheese, Spanish omelet and other tapas. After that a hot chocolate with pastry fritters, named "churros".
