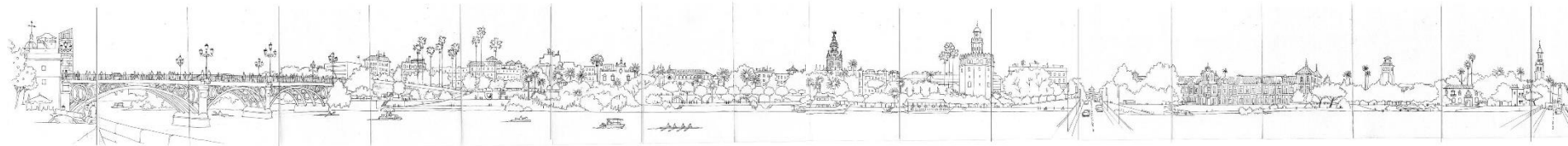
Eating out: Tapas is the king and queen of Sevilla. Hundreds of tapas bars and tapas terraces spread along every corner in the city.

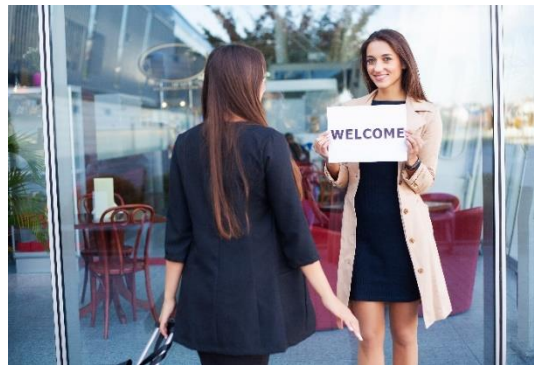

Day 1

MORNING: PANORAMIC WALKING GUIDED VISIT OF SEVILLE

Location: city center

Min/Max: 25 pax per guide

Duration: 2h30

This panoramic walking visit of Seville offers a comprehensive overview of the city's most iconic landmarks.

Start your walk in the heart of the city at the Giralda Tower and the majestic Cathedral; from here, venture into the Santa Cruz district, the city's historic Jewish quarter. Wandering further, you will reach the iconic Alcazar, a Moorish palace.

As you continue your walk, the broad, tree-lined avenues lead you to Plaza España, an architectural masterpiece in the city.

A walking visit in Seville is a delightful journey through time, culture and vibrant Andalusian life. As you stroll through the city's narrow, cobblestone streets, each step reveals layers of history, from Moorish rule to the Golden age of Spain's imperial power.



LUNCH: TAPAS TOUR



Discover the "Tapeo", the Spanish gastronomic culture that consists of going around the bars to taste a different tapas in each of them.

We suggest you go with a specialized guide with whom you will visit 4 local bars; The menu includes 8 tapas and 5 drinks.

The duration of the activity is approximately 3.30 hours. Participants will be separated into small groups of 10-15 people, each accompanied by their English-speaking guide.

Included: English-speaking gastronomic guide, menu, bookings and table set-up in each bar



AFTERNOON: GUIDED VISIT & DANCE CLASS IN MUSEUM OF FLAMENCO

Location: city center

Min/Max: 20 pax per guide and workshop

Duration: 1h45

The museum of Flamenco dance is a cultural hub dedicated to the history and evolution of flamenco. It showcases exhibits on the dance's roots, costumes, instruments and famous performers through interactive displays, multimedia presentations and live performances.

The workshop has a duration of 45 min and offers participants a hands-on experience of the passionate art of flamenco dance. Led by an expert instructor, the class covers basic flamenco rhythms, footwork, hand movement and body posture. The workshop emphasis expression, timing and connection to the music, giving attendees a taste of authentic flamenco culture.



EVENING: GUIDED TOUR OF THE ALCAZAR PALACE OUT OF PUBLIC HOURS

Location: city center

Min/Max: 25 pax per guide

Duration: 1h00

Visiting the Alcazar Palace outside of public hours offers an enchanting and intimate experience of this magnificent historic site. As you step into the palace, the usual crowds are absent, allowing you to fully immerse in the serene beauty of its Moorish architecture.

Originally built as a Moorish fortress in the 10th century, this UNESCO World Heritage site has been expanded over the centuries into a dazzling royal palace that showcases a unique blend of Mudejar, Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque styles. As you explore, you will marvel at the intricate tilework, stunning stucco decorations and beautiful arches.

A visit outside the public hours offers a more personal connection to the history of the Alcazar; the experience feels timeless, as if you have been granted a private audience with Spain's history and cultural legacy.



DINNER AT RIO GRANDE

Location: on the banks of the Guadalquivir River, in Triana quarter.

Capacity: Rio Grande room – up to 120 pax / Giralda room up to 24 pax / Terrace up to 60 pax / Limonero Garden up to 120 pax seated – 300 pax cocktail

Rio Grande is situated on the banks of the Guadalquivir River, overlooking the Torre del Oro, in a historic area of Seville. It features a gastronomic concept centered around high-quality Andalusian products.

Ambiance: A sober and elegant space with various areas. It consists of an interior section serving as the main dining room and two exterior zones with river views. The terrace extends from the dining room, and the lemon grove courtyard stretches along the riverside.

Cuisine: composed of fresh and seasonal products, the restaurant is known for its dishes cooked on the coals which gives the dishes a unique flavor.





Day 2

MORNING: GUIDED VISIT OF THE CATHEDRAL'S ROOFTOP

Location: city center

Min/Max: 25 pax per visit

Duration: 90 min

Visiting the rooftop of the Seville's Cathedral is an unforgettable experience. The journey begins with a climb up a series of ramp, the ascent provides glimpses of the cathedral's interior, including its intricate stonework and gothic features.

The rooftop itself is an architectural marvel. Visitors can observe the flying buttresses, spires and pinnacles of the gothic cathedral up close, details that are often invisible from the ground.

The visit is guided, offering fascinating insights into the construction process, history and legends associated with the cathedral. Your guide will likely point out interesting details such as the weight of the cathedral's massive dome or how parts of the structure were reconstructed after damage from earthquakes.



MORNING: TASTINGS OF LOCAL PRODUCTS: OLIVE OIL, IBERIAN HAM AND SHERRY WINES

Duration: 1 hours each tasting (as many as you want between the 3 options).

Location: city center.

We offer you a gastronomic activity where you will discover some of the typical products of Spain.

We will focus on the generous wines of Jerez: Manzanillas, Amontillados, Palo Cortado and Pedro Ximenez. Differences between them, methods of elaboration, etc. Wines over thirty years old that are authentic oenological gems...

The same analytical steps are carried out for the tasting of other liquid products such as olive oil.

A symbol of Spanish culture and gastronomy, Iberian ham is one of the culinary jewels of the Iberian Peninsula.

Its artisanal production method has remained intact until today and it has been successfully exported all over the world, where it is appreciated and even revered as a real delicacy.



LUNCH AT CASA CARMEN

Location: historic city center

Capacity max: 120 pax

Casa Carmen is a charming and contemporary restaurant. It is an ideal spot for casual for casual lunch or dinner. Located near the Torre del Oro, it offers a convenient location when you are exploring the city.

Ambiance: The restaurant's interior features a stylish warm and inviting décor, combining a blend of classic and modern design elements.

Cuisine: Casa Carmen offers a mix of traditional Spanish cuisine and modern Mediterranean dishes.



AFTERNOON: PANORAMIC BIKE GUIDED TOUR

Location: city center

Min/Max: max 15 pax per guide

Duration: 2h30

The panoramic bike guided tour is an active and engaging way to explore Seville offering a scenic and informative ride through the city's most iconic landmarks.

This tour usually takes 2h30 and it is led by expert guides. The city boasts an extensive network of bike lanes and paths.

Participants will discover the monumental area, pedal along the Guadalquivir river, enjoying panoramic views from Triana bridge. The tour also weaves through lush green spaces like María Luisa Park and a group photo can be made in the amazing Plaza de España.



DINNER AT TABLAO EL ARENAL WITH FLAMENCO SHOW

Location: historic city center, in Arenal district
Capacity: up to 100 pax

Founded in 1975 by the famous flamenco dancer Curro Vélez, El Arenal has a rich history and tradition of showcasing flamenco performances. It is a “Tablao” which is a term used in Spain for venue dedicated to flamenco shows.

Ambiance: The venue is designed to replicate the ambiance of a traditional Andalusian courtyard. It has a warm and rustic décor that adds the authentic feel of the flamenco experience.

Show: It is known for its nightly flamenco shows, featuring some of the finest dancers, singers and guitarists in the flamenco world. Each show typically last 1h30.

Cuisine: different menus are available; A tapas menu with dishes to share and a 3-course individual menu. The dinner is served before the show and last 1 hour.





Day 3

VISIT OF THE TRIANA'S MARKET AND COOKING WORKSHOP

Location: city center

Min/Max: kitchens available for groups of 10 pax-16 pax-25 pax

Duration: 3h30

This activity is a Spanish cooking workshop with a tour of the local market.

This activity starts at 10:30 AM with the visit of the market of Triana during 30 minutes.

From 11:00 AM to 14:00 PM the activity will begin it consists of the design of a complete menu (with 2 drinks included): cold soup (gazpacho type), starter and main course (dessert being pre-made).

As the kitchens are located inside the market, the recipes are made with local products.

Regarding the recipes there are 2 options:

- 1º) cooking a starter and paella main course .
- 2º) cooking 4 traditional tapas.

During the elaboration, an aperitif will be served.

Finally, when you're done, you'll be able to enjoy your own food.



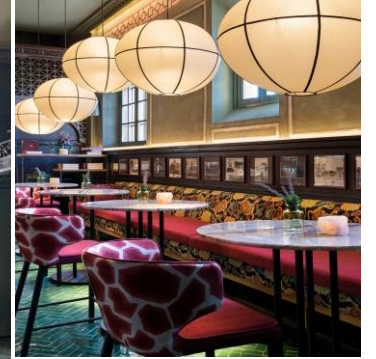
DINNER AT CASA ANÍBAL

Location: historic city center
Capacity: up to 45 pax seated

The restaurant is located in a unique setting, a historic building dating back to 1914, the work of the famous regionalist architect Aníbal González.

Ambiance: Casa Anibal has a welcoming and relaxed atmosphere, featuring a mix of modern and classic Andalusian decor. The restaurant is often described as cozy and comfortable, making it a great place for casual dining.

Cuisine: The restaurant serves traditional Andalusian dishes with a modern twist. The menu typically includes a variety of meat and fish options, as well as fresh, seasonal ingredients.

Day 4

Cordoba is located at around 2 hours from Seville; it is a UNESCO World Heritage site, famous for its impressive Mezquita-Cathedral and for being the emblematic city of the Spanish caliphs. A visit to Cordoba is a unique opportunity to see the Spanish, Islamic and ancient roman architecture combined together.

The Mezquita of Cordoba, is considered one of the best examples of Islamic art in Spain. Under its beautiful arches, it stands right in the centre of the city, surrounded by the old Jewish and Moorish quarters.

Then your guide will lead you to the narrow streets around the Mosque, Cordoba's old Jewish quarter, where you will be able to visit places like the Calleja de las Flores, one of the most famous and typical streets of the area.

Duration of the visit: 3hrs.

Lunch at restaurant El Bandolero:

Casa Palacio Bandolero restaurant is located just opposite to the Mosque, the main monument of the city. This Casa Palacio is a mansion dating from the 17th century, former residence of an aristocracy family, and turned into a restaurant few years ago.

The cuisine of Casa Palacio Bandolero is based on traditional Spanish recipes with local tastes from Cordoba and a rich Arabic accent. The grilled meats and home-made desserts are two of the specialties of the house.



EVENING: PANORAMIC HORSE CARRIAGE TOUR

Location: city center

Min/Max: 4 pax per carriage

Duration: 45 min

The horse panoramic ride in Seville is a charming and leisurely way to explore the city's most iconic sights while enjoying the traditional Andalusian experience of horse-drawn carriages.

This tour offers to visitors a unique perspective, allowing them to take in the historic beauty and cultural richness of Seville at a relaxed pace.

Guests can expect to see highlights like the Maestranza bullring, the Golden Tower, Plaza España and Maria Luisa Park.

The horse carriages can be a mode of transport from the hotel to the venue/restaurant for dinner.



DINNER AT RESTAURANT MANOLO LEON

Location: city center

Capacity: 90 indoor – 50 outdoor

Manolo León is located in an imposing late nineteenth-century house that has now been converted into a restaurant.

It is a multifunctional space, distributed over two floors, with four indoor spaces, and two outdoor spaces formed by a colorful Andalusian patio and a green secret garden on the first floor.

Ambiance: The restaurant features a traditional and cozy decor, reflecting Andalusian charm with a blend of rustic and elegant elements. The interior often includes classic Spanish furnishings and warm colors, creating a welcoming atmosphere.

Cuisine: The restaurant offers traditional Andalusian cuisine with an avant-garde twist based on "everything to share" tapas and quality Spanish food.
