There are various ways of seeing an island, but there aren't many ways of seeing an island in detail in a half or a full day. This has been made possible by means of a jeep safari, however with a difference! The jeeps are authentic ones, also known as DAF trucks. Each jeep carries 8 passengers and 1 driver. Unlike the MARUTI jeeps these come with a driver. All the jeeps will follow each other – in a convoy. A total of 7 of these trucks can be provided. 1 back up truck is available if the safari takes place in Malta. The cars have a maximum speed of 80 km/h, can climb a hill of 65 % and can drive through 76 cm of water. They have a 4.6 ltr, 6 cylinder, petrol engine. Seatbelts, leather seating, fire extinguisher, first aid kit and airbrakes are in each of these trucks.

+ Olive Oil tasting

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Sam Cremona was a former gemologist turned olive-ologist; he is actually an olive oil sommelier! Cremona spearheading a project to cultivate and bring indigenous olives back to Malta and put them on the olive oil map of the world. He's giving away indigenous Bidnija olive trees in order to get 30,000 trees actively growing and producing olives in Malta. This is no easy project to orchestrate, and he's got his hands full being the conductor, but the olive oil I was able to taste makes all of his hard work worth it.

Fresh olive oil is nothing like you purchase in the store back home. It's cloudy in colour, thick, and it has a burst of fresh flavor; sometimes bitter, sometimes sweet. Olive oil and olives are always a part of Maltese cooking.

Tour includes a walk around the estate and olive press, a talk about olive oil production followed by olive oil tasting accompanied by traditional warm ftira , olives, kunserva, gbejniet, anchovies, herbs and local wine and water.

The whole visit lasts an hour and a half to two hours.
