

The Forbidden City, the world's largest and best-preserved Imperial palace complex, is a must for any visitor to Beijing. First opened to the public in 1925, during the Yuan, Ming and Qing Dynasties entry by a commoner was punishable by public execution. Built in the 15th century by 100,000 artisans and a million laborers, it is said to consist of 9,999 rooms, one short of the ancient Chinese number for 'Divine Perfection'. Every brick and carving in the palace is designed with Fengshui, the universal elements, and Yin and Yang in mind. We will guide your guests on a unique and intriguing journey through this magnificent city within a city.



Day 2: the old Hutongs



The Hutongs is a very typical 'Beijing' area, in which Beijinger's have lived for hundreds of years. Here you will have chance to walk through the Hutongs; narrow alleys formed by closely built dwellings in a quadrangle formation, facing onto an inner courtyard. These were built during the Yuan, Ming and Qing dynasties, the sizes and designs varying depending on the social status of the residents. The Hutong's still account for about 15% of all housing in Beijing.





Chinese Tea Ceremony



As with Tai Chi and Calligraphy, traditional Chinese activities each have a place, an order and a purpose. The ancient tradition of serving tea is no different. Performed at weddings and other important events it represents purity, tranquility, respect and harmony. A Chinese Tea Ceremony is one of the best ways to understand the Chinese culture of family and food. Don't forget to rap two knuckles on the table when your tea is poured, the casual Chinese way to say "Thank you" for your tea!

Day 3 Great Wall - Mutianyu Section



This incredible feat of architecture, the greatest of the “New Seven Wonders of the World” saw continuous construction from the 1st (Qin) to the last (Qing) Dynasty of Imperial China. Mutianyu is one of the best-preserved parts of the Great Wall with the surrounding forests and mountainous countryside making for spectacular views. Accessed by cable car, it is also the only section where private helicopter tours are available. Truly amazing.

Day 3 Lunch @ Brickyard



The Brickyard in Huairou is an ideal spot for a meal before or after visiting the Mutianyu section of the Great Wall. Formerly industrial factory producing the glazed tiles used in palaces and temples in Imperial Beijing, today the Brickyard is a sustainable resort that supports the local community. Every single dish they serve is homemade from scratch. They grow many of their own vegetables and fruits, and source about 80 per cent of their ingredients from local suppliers.



Day 4: Muslim Street Markets

Day 5 The Terra Cotta Warrior Museum



The highlight of any stay in Xi'an is a visit to the tomb of The first emperor of China, Qin Shi Huang to view the army built to protect him in the after life. The famous "Terra Cotta Warriors" includes over 8000 warriors of different ranks plus horses and chariots. Miraculously unearthed by a local farmer in 1974 the larger than life army with each face individually and intricately carved it is a wonder of the Ancient World. A testament to the wealth and power of the Emperor.





Day 5 Cycling on the Xi'an City Wall

The Xian City Wall is the most complete ancient city wall in China and also one of the largest and most complete ancient military systems of defence in the world. The city walls were built on the fortifications of the Tang Forbidden City. Cycling on the Wall is an easy and enjoyable activity. The full circuit takes 2 hours but 30 minutes is enough for fun and gives a perspective of the City.





Day 5: Dumpling Dinner at Defachang Restaurant



While “rice” is thought of as the staple of Chinese food. Until recently it was wheat and wheat-based cuisine that was the staple of most of China. The dumpling Banquet that has been served at Defachang for more than 20 years ago represents many of China’s classic seasonal and festive dishes. An unforgettable experience, because guests can try all kinds of fillings and different designs of dumplings.

Day 6 - Old Shanghai



For almost 2000 years, Shanghai was a quiet town on the Yangtze River Delta. It, like its neighbor Suzhou was the home to several former court officials who settled here and built beautiful homes and gardens. Then after the Opium Wars, Shanghai was divided up into concessions and “leased” to many of the conquering powers. It rapidly became the Asian equivalent of New York city. Home to stockbrokers, opium lords and most China’s infamous Mafia bosses. It became Asia’s biggest stockmarket and if there was a Chinese equivalent of the Great Gatsby, this is where you would have found him.



Old Town - Yuyuan Gardens



The Yuyuan Gardens are one of the most famous examples of traditional Chinese gardens, located in the Old Town of Shanghai. Built by a wealthy family in the Qing Dynasty, this garden is around 400 years old, but has retained an elegant splendor. Its lakes, decorated pavilions, sculptures, and native plants all contribute to the serenity of the garden. After Yuyuan guests will be invited to a Chinese Tea House for a traditional Chinese Tea Ceremony, then to walk around the Old Town Market, full of local snacks & souvenirs.

Day 7 Shanghai New - Shanghai Tower

Shanghai Tower ranks as China's tallest building and second only to the world at large. The exterior of the building spirals upward like a snake. It twists about one degree per floor to offset the wind effect on higher altitude. This is very important to a super tall building in Shanghai to withstand frequent typhoons. Upon Shanghai Tower Observation Deck, which is the world's highest indoor observation deck, you can enjoy a unique panoramic view of the Huangpu River, the Bund on the west, and several other skyscrapers like the Jin Mao Tower and the World Financial Center on the east bank.





Day 7 Lunch-Latina BBQ



As soon as you step into Latina self-service barbecue restaurant, it's like being taken to the passionate Brazil. The interior decoration is full of strong Brazilian style, making people feel like they are in a foreign land. The variety of grilled meat here is dazzling. Many banks and financial companies built impressive offices here in the early 20th century when Shanghai was the financial capital of Asia. To Westerners, it was for years Asia's Wall Street where fortunes were made and lost.



Day 7: Dinner at Lost Heaven



Lost Heaven's design concept draws from artistic and cultural elements of minority tribes in Yunnan. The founders experimented with indigenous recipes and cooking techniques from the region, combining them with other elements of Southeast Asian cuisine. Lost Heaven presents incredible fusion dishes and wow with their stunning décor.
